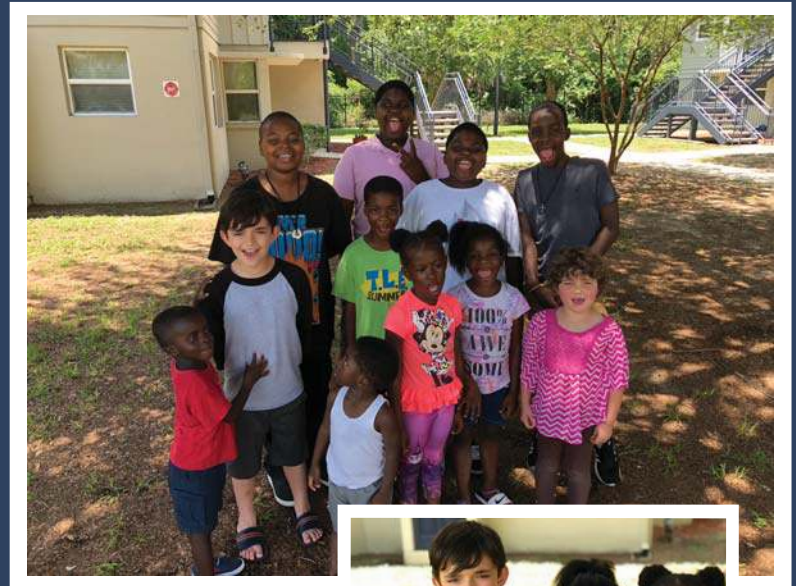

ABILITY HOUSING

Ability Housing develops and operates quality rental housing affordable to persons with extremely limited incomes; administers rental assistance to help chronically homeless households access market rate housing; and partner's with area service organizations to ensure residents have the supports they require to maintain their housing and increase their independent living skills. We are good neighbors that strengthen neighborhoods and improve communities.



LETTER FROM THE CEO AND BOARD CHAIR

2017 was a time of growth and challenges for Ability Housing; and still a time of great successes. Last year we provided housing to over 1,000 people; 94% of whom retained their housing. These are the successes that are most important to us. And we thank all who partnered with us to make them possible.

Ability Housing also received the Neighborhood Builders Award from Bank of America, a very prestigious honor. And we were asked by the Jessie Ball duPont Fund to submit a proposal as they reassessed how the fund define eligibility for support.

Because of our reputation for quality, at the end of 2017 Ability Housing was asked to help a Tampa Bay area nonprofit with two projects that were at risk of being defunded due to the nonperformance of their for-profit partner.

And in 2017 we were successful in working with the City of Jacksonville to amend its zoning code to better protect the rights of persons with a disability.

Because of all this hard work in 2017, in 2018 Ability Housing will begin construction on three properties; and will have an additional four properties in underwriting and preparing for construction in 2019.

With this growth, we will be creating 428 quality affordable and supportive homes in Duval, Orange and Pasco Counties. We will own 323 of these apartments, and we will be helping three other nonprofits develop 105 apartments.

Thank you to everyone who supported Ability Housing as we strive to build communities where everyone has a home.

Fostering Independence



OUR PROGRAMS

HOUSINGLINK

HousingLink enables persons with disabilities who have experienced long-term or repetitive homelessness to access community housing via rental assistance and supportive services. This program enables Ability Housing to expand the housing options it offers and help more people exit homelessness - forever.

VILLAGES

The Villages Program consists of quality, multi-family, rental housing designed to serve low income families as well as individuals and families who are at risk of or have experienced homelessness.

Each of the Villages properties is dedicated to fostering the dignity, increased independence and self-sufficiency of all our residents. We also partner with local organizations to offer supportive services, training programs, and workshops to enhance the residents' quality of life and their self-sufficiency.

CASA

CASA is Ability Housing's first housing program. It consists of 29 single family rental homes scattered throughout the community, providing quality, affordable housing for adults with disabilities

KENNY

Kenny has lived in one of Ability Housing's CASA homes for 15 years. He loves having a home of his own.

Laura, Kenny's sister tell us, "I never would have dreamed when Kenny and I were growing up that he would have the opportunity to live in a house of his own.

I always expected that he would either live with family or in a group home. Thank you for continuing to provide housing and subsidies for those with disabilities. Although Kenny has lived in both of these situations before, living in his own home has been much better for him. Having his own home has been the best place for him."



PILOT PROGRAM

The Solution That Saves is part of a statewide pilot to provide Florida-specific data concerning the effectiveness of providing Permanent Supportive Housing for high utilizers of crisis services. **The Solution That Saves** consists of 90 units of Permanent Supportive Housing targeted to low-income persons who are homeless or unstably housed and identified by the community as persons repetitively cycling through costly systems of care.

The year-one interim findings demonstrate a meaningful and impactful decrease in total costs, arrests and crisis healthcare utilization.

POST HOUSING

- Jacksonville Sheriff's Office reported a **78%** reduction in arrests and bookings
- Days spent in jail were reduced by **89%**
- Hospital costs decreased by **63%**
- Emergency room visits fell by **73%**
- Homeless and crisis services costs were reduced by **88%**

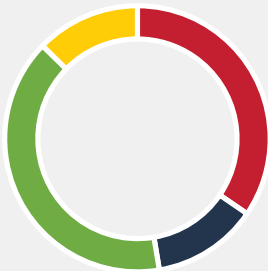

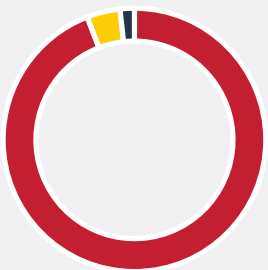
